

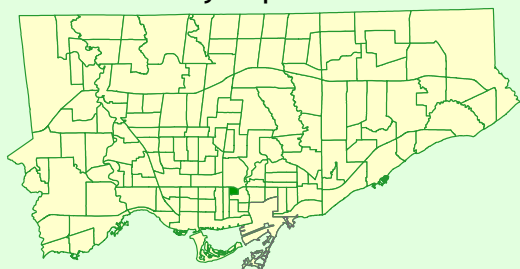

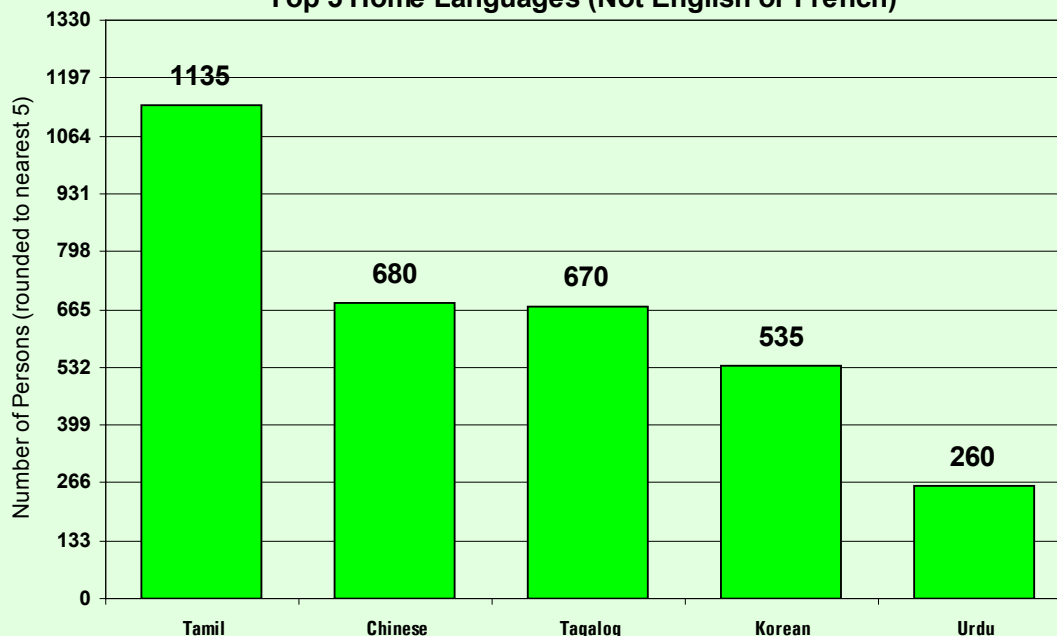

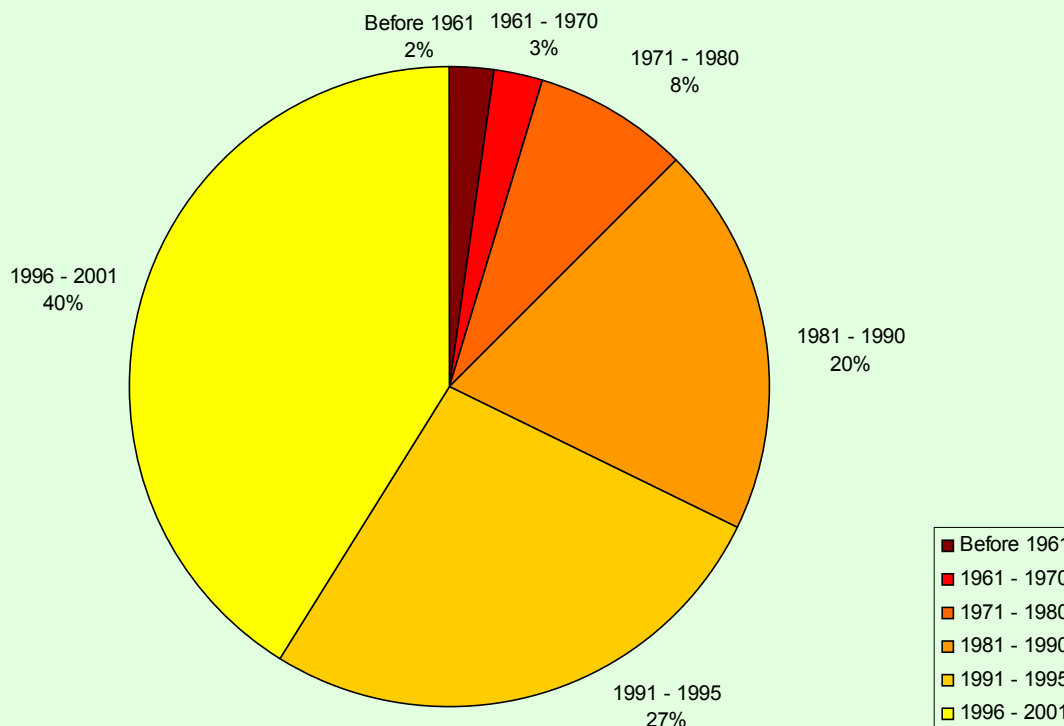

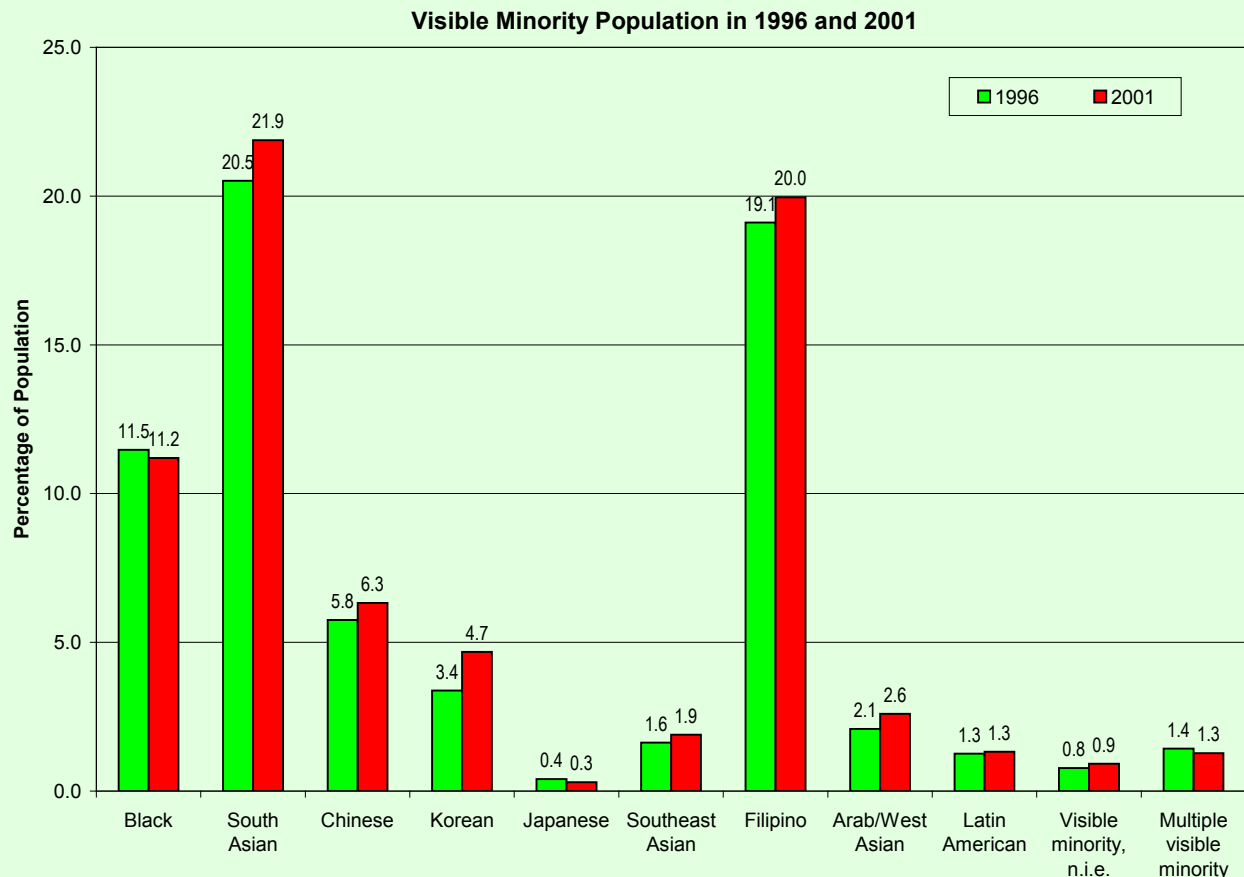
Home language refers to the language spoken most often or on a regular basis at home. Please note that the individual home languages do not always match those used in previous census years.
