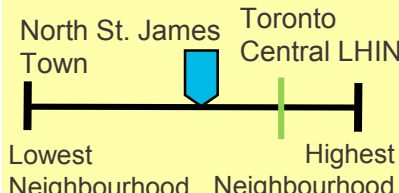

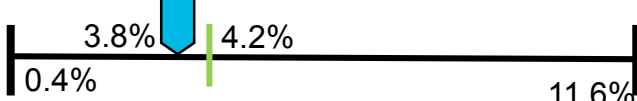

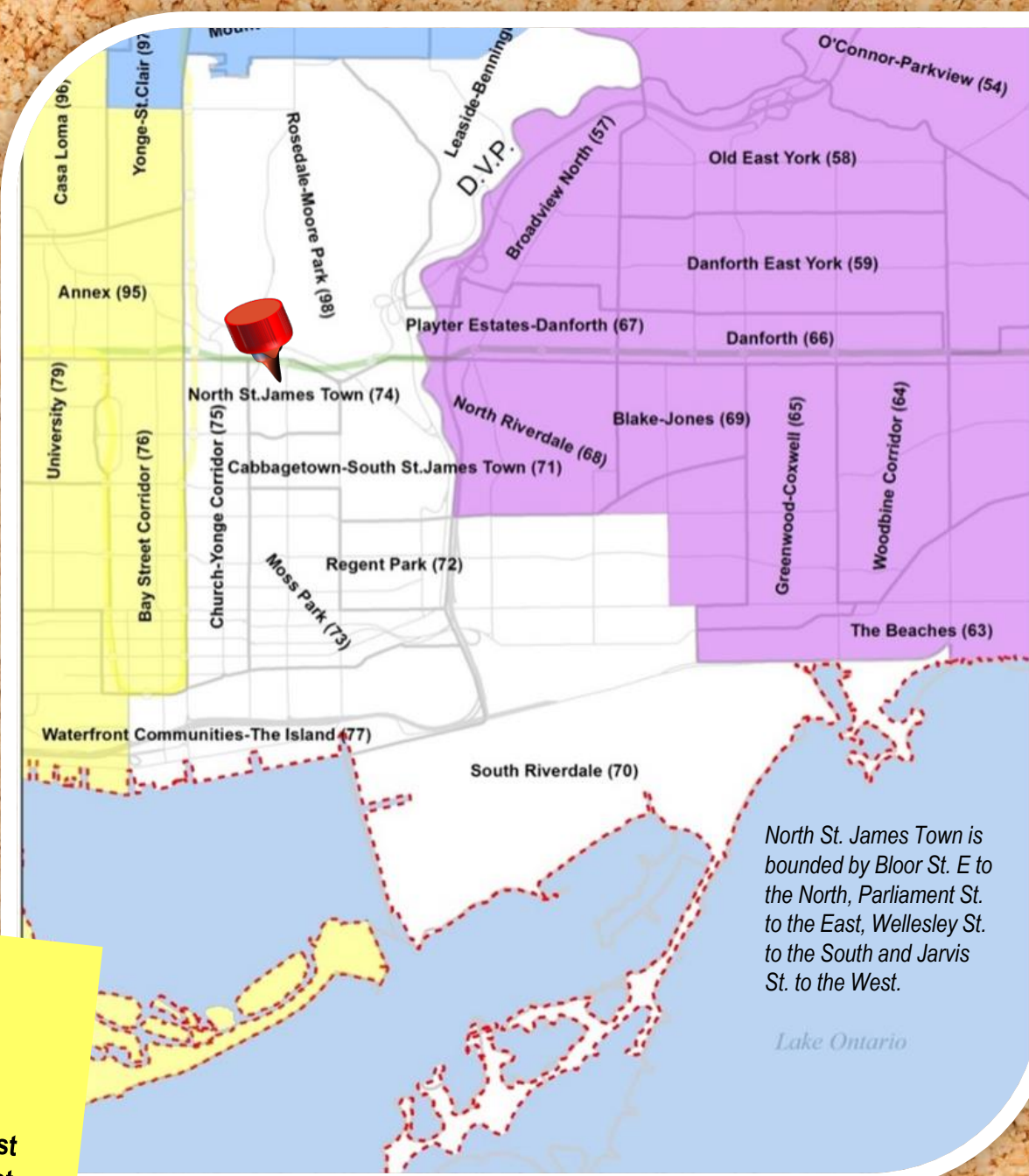

Neighbourhood Highlights

- Lower proportion of seniors (7.9%), but relatively higher proportion of seniors living alone (49.6%)
- Highest immigrant population (54.2%) along with the highest proportion of recent immigrants (34.8%) among the Mid-East Toronto neighbourhoods
- Second largest proportion of visible minority population in the sub-region (65.2%)
- Relatively high proportion of residents living with low income and lower proportion of residents with post secondary education compared to Toronto Central LHIN
- 2% of the population speak French as their mother tongue
- 1 Homeless shelter with 11 beds
- Prevalence rates for diabetes, high blood pressure and COPD is higher than the sub-region and Toronto Central LHIN rates (785.9)
- Higher proportion of ED visits per 1,000 by children ages 0-4
- High utilization of ED for low urgency visits for ages 0-19
- Low screening rates along with low continuity in primary care

How Do We Use Our Health System?

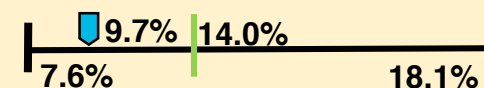
One out of every 4 people (Age 19+) in North St. James Town have **low continuity of Primary Care**

About one out of 2 eligible women in North St. James Town get regular **Mammogram Screening**.

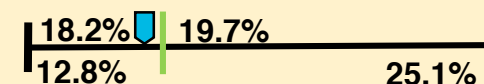
Two out of 5 eligible women get regular **Pap Smear Screening**.

North St. James Town residents have a **lower** percentage of Alternative Level of Care (ALC) days for all ages and seniors compared to the Toronto Central LHIN average.

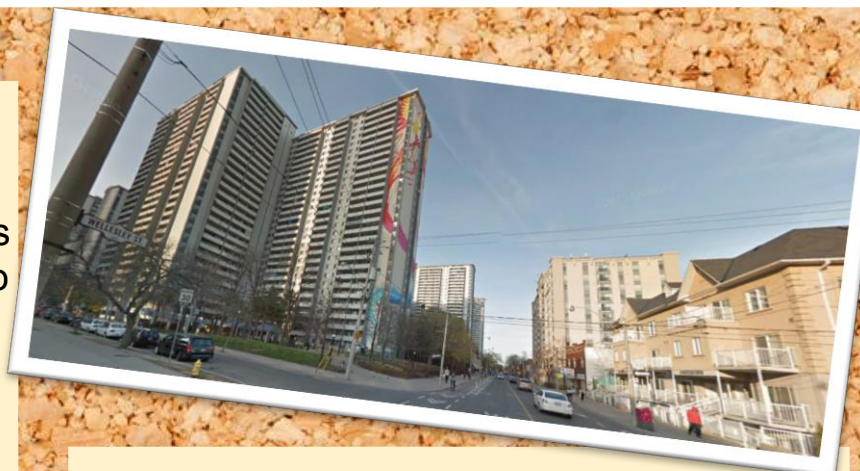
% ALC Days (All Ages)



% ALC Days (Ages 65+)

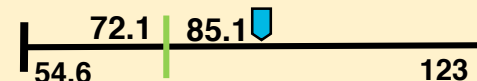

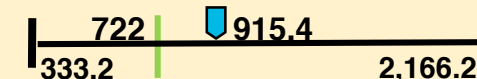

Inpatient Rate of Hospitalization for All Conditions (per 1,000)

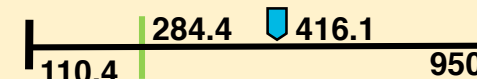

Inpatient Rate of Hospitalization for Mental Health Condition (per 100,000)

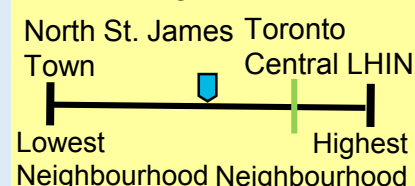


Inpatient Rate of Hospitalization for Ambulatory Care Sensitive Conditions (per 100,000)

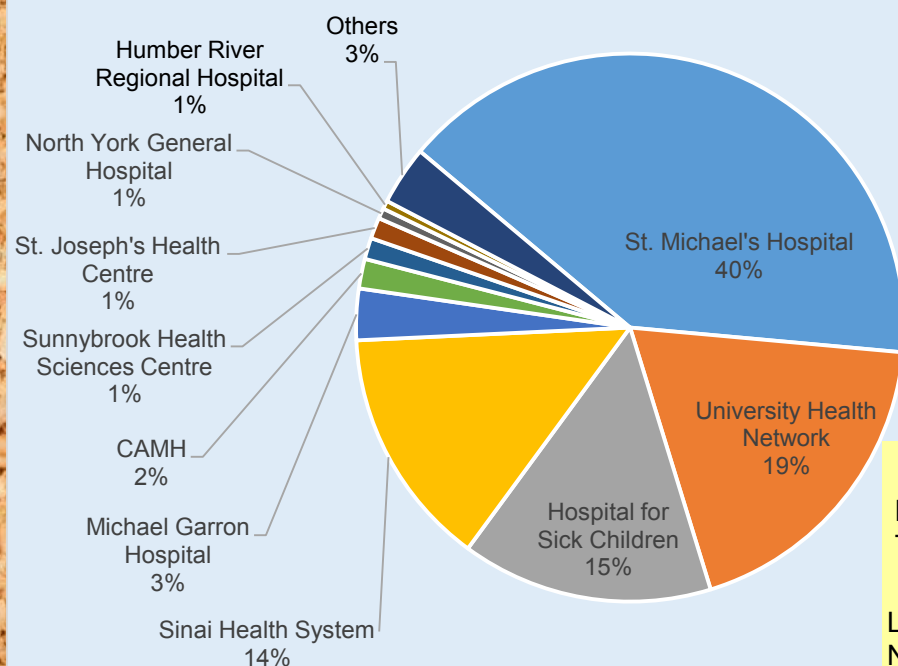

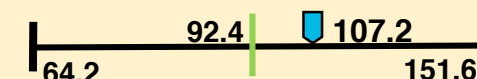


Top 10 Hospitals for Emergency Department Visits by North St. James Town Residents, FY2015/16

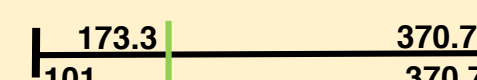

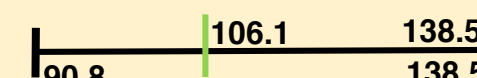
Low Urgency ED Visit Rates (All Ages):

In **Mid-East Toronto sub-region**, the proportion of select community services delivered in Toronto Central LHIN and being used by its residents are:

- **28%** of the people who receive **mental health case management services** reside in **Mid-East Toronto sub-region**.*
- **13%** of the people who receive **addictions treatment-substance abuse** reside in **Mid-East Toronto sub-region**.*
- **11%** of the people who receive CCAC services by **personal support workers** in Toronto Central LHIN reside in **Mid-East Toronto sub-region**.
